## **University Joint Benefits - 11/27/12**

Bruce Appleby reported that because the governor has terminated the AFSCME contract, SB1313 (which requires retirees to contribute to their health insurance premiums) is just sitting. There are two lawsuits as a result of this bill. Nobody is sure how premiums will be determined.

The veto session of the 97<sup>th</sup> General Assembly began today (11/27). The thinking is that nothing will happen on pensions during the veto session; rather, pensions will likely be taken up during the period of Jan. 2-9, the so-called "lame-duck" session.
